**a unit of measure, about 18 inches (46 cm)**

A cubit is about as long as a man's hand and forearm.

**a plant grown for its seedlike fruit**

Does your mother use cummin in cooking?

**skillful**

Daniel and his friends were cunning in knowledge.

**a law**

The king sent forth a hard decree.

**to pollute or make oneself impure or sinful**

Daniel would not defile himself with the king's food.

**dethroned; removed from a position of authority**

The wicked king was deposed from his high position.

**scorned and thought light of**

The older generation of Israel despised the land.

**ate completely**

An evil beast had not devoured Joseph.

**lessened the total strength or number of**

As a child, Samuel wore an ephod.

**to explain the meaning**  
The Philistines could not expound Samson's riddle.

**chains used to keep a prisoner from escaping**  
The Philistines held Samson with fetters.

**units of liquid measure**  
The stone waterpots contained two firkins each.

**a tough or strong fiber used to make linen cloth**  
Flax burns rapidly.

**a woolly sheepskin**  
Gideon used a fleece to determine God's will.

**deserted**  
Israel had often forsaken God.

**any bird.**  
God created every winged fowl.

**to worry**  
Hannah did fret because of her adversary's unkindness.

**one who runs from the law or another person**  
After killing Abel, Cain became a fugitive.

**a bitter drink often given to help relieve pain**  
Jesus refused the gall offered by the soldiers.

**carved or cut out**  
Do not make unto thee any graven image.

**to listen carefully and do as told**  
Adam wrongly hearkened unto Eve instead of God.

**listened carefully to and did as told**  
Israel hearkened not unto the Lord.

**a young cow; a term once used to refer to a young wife**  
In his riddle, Samson referred to his young wife as "my heifer."

**from this time on**  
God said to Cain, "Henceforth you shall be a fugitive on the earth."

**a flowering plant**  
God caused the earth to bring forth every herb.

**white frost; small, feathery pieces of ice on the ground**  
Manna was as small as hoar frost.

**a cry or shout of praise**  
The children sang a loud hosanna to the Lord.

**became greater or deeper**  
The Flood waters increased and lifted the Ark.

**area of authority**  
Jesus' trial was under Herod's jurisdiction.

**excited or stirred up**  
Saul's anger was greatly kindled.

**relatives**  
Abraham left his kindred when he followed God.

**cows**  
In Pharaoh's dream seven thin kine did eat seven fat kine.

<b>lamentation</b> SS-1063	n. lām'ən • tē / shen Genesis 50:10	<b>a noise of grief; the cries of sadness</b> When Jacob was buried, Joseph's soldiers stood by with great lamentation.
<b>lamented</b> SS-1065	v. lē • mēn' / tīd I Samuel 7:2	<b>mourned aloud; cried</b> When trouble came, Israel lamented after the Lord.
<b>leavened</b> SS-1063	adj. lēv'end Exodus 13:3	<b>raised or caused to rise with yeast, as bread</b> The Israelites were not to eat leavened bread at the Feast.
<b>lentiles</b> SS-1062	n. lēn' / tīlz Genesis 25:34	<b>seeds of certain plants used as food</b> Jacob gave Esau lentiles to eat.
<b>lineage</b> SS-1068	n. līn' / ī • ūj Luke 2:4	<b>descent; family group or line</b> Mary was of the lineage of David.
<b>lingered</b> SS-1063	v. līng' / gerd Genesis 43:10	<b>took extra time; waited</b> Joseph's brothers lingered until Jacob agreed to send Benjamin.
<b>lowing</b> SS-1065	n. lō' / īng I Samuel 15:14	<b>the mooing sound of cattle</b> Samuel heard the oxen lowing.
<b>lucre</b> SS-1065	n. lōō' / ker I Samuel 8:3	<b>money that is considered bad or received improperly</b> Because they wanted lucre, Samuel's sons disobeyed the Lord.
<b>molten</b> SS-1064	adj. mōl' / ten Exodus 32:4	<b>melted and cast or molded to form a statue</b> Aaron made a molten calf.
<b>mortar</b> SS-1062	n. mōr' / ter Genesis 11:3	<b>a mixture used to keep bricks together; mortar</b> The people at Babel used mortar when they built the tower.
<b>mouldy</b> SS-1064	adj. mōld' / ē Joshua 9:5	<b>old and decaying with a greenish, woolly-looking growth</b> The men of Gibeon had mouldy bread.
<b>obeisance</b> SS-1063	n. ō • bā' / sēns Genesis 37:7	<b>a respectful gesture or act, usually a bow</b> The sheaves of Joseph's brothers made obeisance to his sheaf.
<b>occasion</b> SS-1066	n. ē • kā' / zhēn Daniel 6:4	<b>an opportunity; a cause or reason</b> The presidents and princes tried to find an occasion to accuse Daniel.
<b>ointment</b> SS-1068	n. ōint' / ment John 12:5	<b>a sweet-smelling mixture used as medicine</b> Mary anointed Jesus' feet with ointment.
<b>ordinance</b> SS-1063	n. ōr' / de • nens Exodus 12:14	<b>a rule or a law</b> An ordinance commanded the Israelites to remember the day forever.
<b>peradventure</b> SS-1062	adv. pūr' / əd • vēn' / chēr Genesis 24:5	<b>perhaps; if it be the case that</b> Peradventure the woman will not be willing to come with me.
<b>perceived</b> SS-1065	v. pēr • sēvd' / I Samuel 3:8	<b>understood</b> Eli perceived that the Lord had called Samuel.
<b>perpetual</b> SS-1061	adj. pēr • pēch' / ōō • el Genesis 9:12	<b>continual; lasting forever</b> God made a perpetual covenant with Noah.
<b>perverted</b> SS-1065	v. pēr • vūr' / tīd I Samuel 8:3	<b>distorted; wrong</b> Samuel's sons perverted judgment.
<b>perverteth</b> SS-1068	v. pēr • vūr' / tēth Luke 23:14	<b>leads astray</b> The Jews wrongly thought of Jesus as one that perverteth the people.
<b>petition</b> SS-1066	n. pē • tīsh' / en Daniel 6:7	<b>a request</b> No man presented a petition to anyone but the king.
<b>petition</b> SS-1065	n. pē • tīsh' / en I Samuel 1:17	<b>a request</b> Eli granted Hannah's petition.
<b>phylacteries</b> SS-1068	n. fē • lāk' / te • rēz Matthew 23:5	<b>small cases worn by Jewish men as a reminder to keep the law</b> The phylacteries were fastened to the forehead and the left arm.
<b>pitch</b> SS-1061	n. pīch Genesis 6:14	<b>a thick, black, sticky mixture used to make things waterproof</b> Noah used pitch in making the Ark.
<b>plaster</b> SS-1066	n. plās' / ter Daniel 5:5	<b>a wall covering made of finely ground rock</b> A man's hand wrote words on the plaster.
<b>pomegranate</b> SS-1065	adj. pōm' / grān' / īt I Samuel 14:2	<b>a tree bearing thick-skinned, red fruit with many seeds</b> Saul waited under a pomegranate tree.
<b>portion</b> SS-1065	n. pōr' / shēn I Samuel 1:5	<b>a part</b> Hannah's husband gave her a special portion of his goods.
<b>posterity</b> SS-1063	n. pōs • tēr' / ē • tē Genesis 45:7	<b>one's line of descendants or future relatives</b> God sent Joseph to Egypt to preserve a posterity on the earth.

**vegetables; the seeds of certain plants**

Daniel ate pulse rather than the king's rich food.

**a case for arrows**

Esau took his quiver and his bow as he left to hunt.

**clothing**

Abraham's servant gave Rebekah beautiful raiment.

**clothing; that which is worn**

Joseph changed his raiment before he went unto Pharaoh.

**a kingdom; the area under one's control**

The king appointed Daniel over the whole realm.

**to control by keeping back**

Joseph could not refrain from crying.

**to refill something that has become empty**

After the Flood, Noah did replenish the earth as God commanded.

**a disgrace or dishonor to one's family, name, or country**

Saul's enemy wanted to bring a reproach upon Israel.

**goat's hair; coarse cloth worn as a sign of grief or sorrow**

The men sanctified a young man to keep the Ark of the Lord.

**a safe place**
